In the Southern Tauern Mountains, which rise to between 700 and 2,800 metres, lies the Murau region, a unique combination of picture-perfect mountain landscapes, idyllic valleys and pastures, and lush green woods and meadows.

The Murau Region's beautifully designed themed trails not only provide stunning views, they also provide information about the region's diverse natural landscape and culture.

There's something for all the family, with a wide range of play areas along the routes. Trails that are particularly suitable for children are identified with the Murlis Family Tipp quality mark.

# **Nocky's AlmZeit Adventure**



#### **CIRCULAR ROUTE**

#### **TURRACHER HÖHE**

Your guide on this trail is Nocky the Mountain Bunny. He takes children and their parents on a two-hour walk around the AlmZeit circuit with fun games, quizzes and all sorts of information on the theme of time. Climb to the Sky, Chime Fence, Viewpoint: these are just some of the seven stations that await you on this pint-sized adventure.

## Turracher 3 Lakes Trail



#### **CIRCULAR TRAIL**

#### **TURRACHER HÖHE**

The Turracher Three Lakes Trail is an exceptional opportunity to immerse yourself in the stunning natural surroundings of the Nock Mountains. To consciously take in nature with all your senses or simply enjoy your impressions.

The walk through the mountains between Lake Turrach, the Grünsee and the Schwarzsee takes a pleasant two or three hours. You can also walk around Lake Turrach in 30 minutes.

**Distance:** 7.5 km | **Duration:** 2 to 3 hours

#### **PREDLITZ**

Hoher Steg circuit incl. Predlitz via ferrata The Hohe Steg – a short but spectacular ravine that was formed around 12,000 years ago through meltwater erosion.

It can be viewed from a circular walk or crossed a via ferrata – difficulty level A-C, length 400m.

Climbing equipment is essential for the via ferrata!

#### **CIRCULAR TOUR**

#### ST. RUPRECHT

The Arboretum is a generously proportioned botanical garden that is devoted to trees and accessible to the public. Numerous familiar but rare indigenous species of trees and shrubs can be seen here. Paths wind through the whole site. A tree walk with a woodlands specialist is a playful way of getting to know the flora better.

The site also includes ample rest areas, a barefoot path, an insect hotel, an anthill, a seminar cabin and a snack but

#### ST. GEORGEN/KREISCHBERG

Explorers both big and small can get a fun booklet from the information office and stamp it as they tour St. Georgen.

The route around the village includes colourful little houses concealing letter stamps.

After successfully completing their detective work, explorers can collect a small prize from the tourist association information office.

#### **CIRCULAR TRAIL**

#### ST. GEORGEN/KREISCHBERG

In the summer, the World Cup resort of Kreischberg turns into a hiking area for the whole family. The 10-seater gondola lift carries visitors in comfort from the valley floor to an altitude of 1,800m above sea level. It's only a short distance from the top station of the gondola to Dinowald dinosaur forest, where you can meet all sorts of primitive giant beasts. You can also try disc golf - another fun sporting activity.

#### MURAU/FRAUENHAIN

This meticulously prepared animal trail enables children to encounter the animals of the forest and learn more about them.

The explanatory boards give young explorers an understanding of the animal world, telling them about the behaviour of the animals that live in the forest, and their young.

The Frauenhain Animal Trail can be accessed from the Frauenalpe ascent.

**Distance:** 1.5 km | **Duration:** 45 minutes









#### **CIRCULAR TOUR**

#### **MURAU TOWN**

A fascinating and informative experience for all ages. The treasure map (available from the tourism association information office) helps you to explore the town of Murau and its surroundings. Red letters that make up a keyword are hidden all over the town.

When children give the keyword at the tourism association information office in Murau, they receive a certificate and a little prize.

#### MURAU/ST. LEONHARDTEICH

Get some exercise in the fresh air with magnificent views of artistic monuments such as the ruins of Grünfels Castle and the Hungerturm tower. The "Gesunde Runde" health circuit is made up of ten stations: climbing bars, monkey bars, different walking, slackline and more. Each station has texts and images explaining how to use them, and how they can benefit backs, abdomens and biceps.

# Woods, Waters, Peaks

#### **CIRCULAR TRAIL**

#### **RANTEN**

As you walk along this forest trail with 11 themed stations providing information about the interlinked ecosystem of the woods and waters, you enjoy stunning views of the Tauern Mountains. This impressive circuit starts and finishes at the Martin Zeiller path and the garden of the same name. Martin Zeiller the Younger, born in Ranten in 1589, is considered one of the outstanding travel writers and encyclopedists of his age.

**Distance:** 16 km | **Duration:** 6 hours

#### STAGED TRAIL

#### KRAKAU

The goal of hiking is to deepen our relationship as humans with the landscape around us. Both the trails themselves, and selected spots along the routes, offer a wide range of opportunities to encounter and appreciate the natural beauty of the landscape in a sensitive manner. Exposed locations provide wonderful insights into the countryside and allow us to bring our own feelings and thoughts into the expanse of the alpine landscape.

# Eselsberg Alpine Experience

#### **CIRCULAR TOUR**

#### ST. PETER/KAMMERSBERG

Anyone wanting to learn about Alpine farming past and present, about flora and fauna or about what it's like to live in harmony with nature in the Alps can expand their knowledge at seven stations along the route. Along with the stations you can be fascinated by the "Summstein" (humming rock) and have fun with the Archimedean spiral at the Eselsberger creek play area. It's an outing that's well worth it and where you can learn a great deal about Alpine farms and their management.



#### STAGED TRAIL

#### ST. PETER/KAMMERSBERG

Along the Geopfad (geological trail), a hike from the tranquil village of Baierdorf to the Sölk Pass, 24 stations provide clear and highly accessible explanations of a wide variety of impressive terrain and the geological processes that have shaped it.

#### **CIRCULAR TRAIL**

#### ST. PETER/KAMMERSBERG

Hear the birdsong in the forest and see our native animal species up close. The Going Wild circular trail is a fantastic experience for all ages. Discover life-size illustrations of a wide variety of native wild animals over the trail's 1.2 km, along with boards providing information about each of the animals. It's the ideal combination of learning and fun, enabling you to get to know the diversity of our native species.

#### Admission free

**Distance:** 2.7 km | **Duration:** 1.5 hours









#### **OBERWÖLZ**

At the 10 stations around the circular trail in Oberwölz, larger-than-life-size wooden sculptures including an accurate model lumberjack's hut, a dragon playground and other attractions provide an insight into the world of myths and legends for visitors to experience at first hand.

Admission free

**Distance:** 3 km | **Duration:** 2 hours

#### CIRCULAR TRAIL

#### **LACHTAL**

About 4 km long, the trail runs at an altitude of between 1,600 and 1,700 metres above sea level, linking a total of 19 activity stations.

The trail consists of stations with motor skills activities, balance exercises, a Calisthenics station (body weight exercises), a water station, rope jungle, slacklining, a petting zoo, climbing facilities and lots of fun for all ages.

Admission free

**Distance:** 4 km | **Duration:** 2.5 hours

#### PERCHAU AM SATTEL

Perchau am Sattel is home to a very special pharmacy.

A wide range of herbs and medicinal plants grow all along the forest's edge. Display boards describe their colours and shapes, and what they are used for.

#### **CIRCULAR TRAIL & STAGED TRAIL**

#### **NEUMARKT**

Learn to read the book of nature.

The Via Natura long-distance hiking trail challenges all visitors to set out on a natural adventure, taking a closer look and thus learning what nature, and all its colours, forms and phenomena, has to teach us. The nature of human beings and the interaction between humans and nature is an integral component of the Via Natura.

Complete the whole circular trail in one go or individual stages.

#### Admission free

Distance: 130 km in 10 stages | Duration: 7 days

**Refreshments:** Guest houses and restaurants along each stage









#### **THEMED HIKE**

#### **ZEUTSCHACH**

Graggerschlucht Gorge and Bionic Island. Graggerschlucht Gorge has Europe's first bionic island, which allows visitors to immerse themselves in the world of bionics. Bionics combines biology and technology, and provides us with ideas and approaches drawn directly from nature that have already been put into practice in many areas. Find out more about this discipline in the wonderful natural setting of Graggerschlucht Gorge and admire the breathtaking cascades of the waterfall at the head of the gorge.

#### **CIRCULAR TRAIL**

#### MÜHLEN

Hörfeld Moor is situated south of Mühlen on the border between Styria and Carinthia, in a basin that was carved out by glaciers in the Ice Age. It is home to over 500 species of butterflies, moths and birds.

A reinforced walkway runs around and across the moor, giving visitors an insight into the vulnerable and protected habitats that comprise it.

Please keep to the marked trail.

Admission free

**Distance:** 4.5 km | **Duration:** 1.5 hours









#### MÜHLEN

Hike the fairytale of Hans in Luck. At the Gössler und Hirschenwirt guest houses in Mühlen, they will give you a "lump of gold" and a bowl. You'll need to take good care of them! After getting some information from the "listening station" at the farm mill, follow in the exciting footsteps of Hans in Luck. At each station you can trade in a cow, a goose or a pig. When you are finally free of all your burdens, the guesthouse will give you a reward. Guided hikes run every Wednesday in the summer holidays.

### Mühlen Adventure Mile



#### CIRCULAR TRAIL

#### ADVENTURE MILE BY MÜHLEN LAKE

A circular trail around Mühlen Lake that offers fun and relaxation for the whole family. Activity areas are great places to take a break, learn, play and relax. The adventure mile trail around the lake offers parents and children beautiful views and also nature activity areas and an adventure playground. Children will love the eight fun and interesting stations on the trail around the lake.

Admission free

Distance: 1.9 km | Duration: 40 minutes

#### **ZEUTSCHACH**

Two trails and one goal on the Alles Familie (all about the family) trail in Zeutschach. Visitors to these two trails can enjoy walking games, chat while they hike, go on little expeditions and have fun with old-fashioned games. (The shorter route is suitable for baby buggies and wheelchair accessible). Every game follows signposts with a quote that reflects what you have just experienced.

The two trails start from the car park right by Graslupp Lake.

**Distance:** 3.6 km or 6 km | **Duration:** 2 or 3.5 hours

# **Mariahof Bee Nature Trail**



#### STAGED TRAIL

#### **MARIAHOF**

Information boards by the trail provide details on the life of bees. Bees are vital to maintaining plant biodiversity, so our farmers pay particular attention to flowering times and sustainable harvesting.

This easy hike runs from Vockenberg to Maierdorf in Mariahof

#### Admission free

**Distance:** 2.5 km | **Duration:** 40 minutes














#### **MARIAHOF**

As a witness to the Ice Age, Dürnberg Moor invites visitors on a voyage of discovery, and its display boards provide them with an insight into its sensitive habitats. Rare animals and plants, such as the carnivorous sundew, can be found here. The look-out tower has views over the landscape of the moor. From the Ice Age island in Oberdorf in Mariahof, the trail leads via the Anawander Organic Farm - Moorstüberl tavern to the moor.

Please keep to the marked trail.

Free entrance

**Distance:** 2.5 km | **Duration:** 40 minutes



#### **CIRCULAR TRAILS**

Wrap up warm, you're heading for the Ice Age. Visit the Ice Age island in Oberdorf/Mariahof or hike one of the three circular trails through the Zirbitzkogel-Grebenzen nature reserve, which was shaped by the Ice Age.

### ST. LAMBRECHT ICE RESERVOIR

This circular trail runs through the town of the same name. The three information points display fascinating evidence of the former ice reservoir that is still visible today. Starting point: Viewing platform in front of the school in St. Lambrecht.

**Distance:** 3.8 km | **Duration:** 1.5 hours

# **Ice Age Hikes**



#### **CIRCULAR TRAILS**

#### OFF ACROSS THE GROUND MORAINE

Several information points on the trail between Oberdorf and Mariahof show how the landscape was formed. The starting point is the Ice Age island in Oberdorf in Mariahof.

Admission free

**Distance:** 9.1 km | **Duration:** 3 hours

#### THE GLACIER IN THE CUL-DE-SAC<sup>2</sup>

The Glacier in the Cul-De-Sac circular trail runs through the area between St. Blasen and Thajagraben and starts from the Ice Age start point in St. Blasen.

Admission free

Distance: 10.2 km | Duration: 4 hours









#### **CIRCULAR TRAIL**

#### ST. BLASEN

This themed trail aims to improve people's health. The St. Blasen Fitness Trail is a slightly rolling path through woods and meadows that provides for a wide variety of training.

A squirrel mascot called Toni accompanies visitors along the trail, leading them round three stations. Between the stations there are quizzes and body weight exercises.

#### Admission free

**Distance:** 2.8 km | **Duration:** 1 to 1.5 hours







#### ST. LAMBRECHT/ST. BLASEN

The Murau Region is of major importance for folk culture. It is a Styrian region that has an incredibly large treasury of songs, which are passed down from generation to generation.

This treasury was preserved thanks to the dedication of Lois Steiner.

Four stations along the trail tell the story of his life and his love of folk music, and encourage visitors to sing along.

**Distance:** 4.8 km | **Duration:** 1.5 hours

# The Murau Region

#### Holiday with added value

From the Turracher Höhe and the high-Alpine Sölk Pass, the majestic peak of the Preber to the endless blue mountain lakes and exquisite Alpine pastures, to the broad valleys to the little medieval towns, the land-scape is very special.

The Murau Region is rich in natural beauty, culture, tradition, cuisine and entertainment.

And the range of excursions, sports and activities it offers is correspondingly diverse.

There is plenty of culture on offer, from guided tours of the little historical towns of Murau and Oberwölz to a visit to the castles in Rothenfels and Murau, to the Wood Museum in St. Ruprecht to the Benedictine Abbey of St. Lambrecht. The region's brewing culture is intrinsically linked to its history. This can be experienced in the "Brewery of the Senses" and the "Beer Pharmacy" in Murau.

There is also no shortage of sporting activities: Cyclists can immerse themselves in the unspoiled countryside along the Mur Bicycle Trail, golfers can improve their handicap in spectacular natural surroundings, and hikers have eight impressive mountains to tackle - or they can learn to read the book of nature on the long-distance Via Natura trail in the Zirbitzkogel-Grebenzen nature reserve.

Anyone wanting to discover unspoiled countryside should take a ride on the Murtalbahn steam train.

Nature lovers can choose from 40 crystal-clear lakes, imposing waterfalls, exceptional gardens and a multitude of places of natural power.
